
Number of Foreign Residents



◆ Changes in Foreign Population

The number of foreign residents in Kikugawa
City is 3,628, and the ratio to the total
population is 7.55%, which is the highest in
Shizuoka Prefecture.

(As of the end of March, 2021)

- ◆ Population Rate by Nationality

 Among the foreign residents (30 countries), roughly 60% are Brazilian nationals, and roughly 20% are Filipino nationals. In recent years, due to the increase of technical intern trainees, Asian nationals such as Vietnamese have been increasing.
- ◆Population Rate by Qualifications

 Foreign residents with permanent residence
 permits without job restrictions accounts for
 84% of all foreign residents. As the number of
 technical intern trainees increases, the types
 of residence status are diversifying.

Among the foreign residents, about 60% are Brazilian nationals, and about 20% are Filipino nationals. In H20 (2008), when issued the first Action Guidelines, Brazilian nationals accounted for about 75% and Filipino nationals for about 10%, indicating a significant change at the rate of nationals. In recent years, due to the increase of technical intern trainees, Asian nationals such as Vietnamese have been increasing.

Basic Concept

Realization of a multicultural society where diversity is respected for everyone's comfortable and vibrant life

Multicultural conviviality refers to "People of different nationalities and ethnicities living together as members of a local community while acknowledging each other's cultural differences and trying to build equal relationship.".

To create a city where residents with limited Japanese skills can live comfortably, we are offering information in multiple languages and easy Japanese. We will establish a system that anyone feels free to consult with us by opening a consultation assistance desk for foreigners.

In addition, we provide opportunities to learn the Japanese language and the living rule in Japan so that they can communicate fully with residents.

- · Multi-lingual response to fire and emergency calls (26 projects)


